



Monday 1 | Nicaragua – Dozens of individuals remain imprisoned for political reasons, many of them held incommunicado or subjected to mistreatment, according to human rights organizations. The prolonged political crisis—marked by repression, exile, poverty, the closure of educational institutions, and widespread fear—has left deep and lasting wounds. Pray for the imprisoned believers and the Church in Nicaragua to be a light for Christ.

Tuesday 2 | North Korea – Today there are an estimated 60,000 Christians imprisoned for their faith in Jesus Christ. These imprisoned believers face interrogation, torture, deplorable conditions and hard labour with little food. Would you pray for the thousands of brothers and sisters in North Korean prisons?

Wednesday 3 | Yemen – In the wake of a government crackdown on Yemeni Christians, many believers were detained, arrested and even imprisoned. Pray for strength for those facing interrogations, imprisonment or family pressures for their faith.

Thursday 4 | Bangladesh – In north Bangladesh, Christian persecution, especially against converts, is rising sharply. Pray for provision and protection over the families forced into hiding.

Friday 5 | Central Asia – Pray with 16-year-old Hysam* from Central Asia. After he was baptized, his Muslim parents beat him and kicked him out of their house.

Saturday 6 | Southeast Asia – Moreane* comes from a Muslim background and has been attending church on and off for the past two years. Our local partner has been walking alongside and encouraging the church to intentionally disciple her as she needs support to return and grow in faith. Please pray that Moreane will have a deep and personal encounter with Christ and that her faith will be firmly rooted in Him.

Sunday 7 | Iran – Pray for Ghazal Marzban, a Christian convert in Iran. She is one of a rising number of religious minorities who have been rearrested. Ask God to be ever-close to our sister.

Monday 8 | China – Pray for China's next generation. A Chinese youth ministry leader shared, "The fiercest spiritual battle is for the faith of the younger generation. Campus ministry workers often face risks, and we need more prayers."



Tuesday 9 | Philippines – Jana shared, "Two years ago, my father locked my doors and bruised my body to keep me from Christ. Now, I see others facing the same shadows. My prayer is that their physical chains would break, and they would find the same freedom I now carry in my heart." Ask the Lord to supernaturally intervene for those currently facing physical abuse or home arrest, providing a way for them to continue in their faith despite oppression.

Wednesday 10 | Eritrea – Praise God! Several Christian prisoners were recently released from Eritrea's notorious prison system. Continue to pray for the release of seven prominent church leaders.

Thursday 11 | Colombia – Please pray for Afro-Colombian churches and congregations serving in historically marginalized territories, where the Christian faith may face neglect, social stigmatization, or increased control. Pray that these churches may carry out their ministry with full religious freedom, without racial, cultural, or spiritual discrimination.

Friday 12 | Venezuela – Pray for God's guidance and wisdom so that the church in Venezuela can be a light amid social tension in a time marked by electoral processes and momentous decisions.

Saturday 13 | Indonesia – Pray that God would accelerate the translation and distribution of the Bible in local languages, knowing that His Word in the heart language anchors believers, deepens understanding, and produces resilient faith in the face of persecution.

Sunday 14 | Yemen – Pray for encouragement and hope for Yemeni believers who have chosen to remain in their land amid intense scrutiny and persecution. Pray they will clearly see the hand of the Lord at work in our lives.

Monday 15 | Rwanda – Pray with us for five Rwandan believers sentenced to prison for "refusing to stop witnessing their faith." Ask God to be near to them and their families.

Tuesday 16 | North Korea – One North Korean believer reminds us of the importance to pray for North Korean family every day. “We still exist thanks to your prayers and support,” he said. “Thank you for praying.”

Wednesday 17 | Iran – Pray with Iranian Christians imprisoned for their faith. Heavenly Father, as we remember our family in prison (Hebrews 13:3), flood their cells with Your presence.

Thursday 18 | Eritrea – Eritrean police on Sunday, March 15, arrested 13 Christians gathered at a single undisclosed location. It is presumed that none of them will benefit from any legal process, as has been the case for the past 24 years. Please pray for the Lord’s provision to the newly arrested Christians. Pray that they may have the grace to honour Christ amid their circumstances.

Friday 19 | Cuba – Increasing geopolitical tensions intensify state surveillance and control, creating a more sensitive environment for religious activity. Pray for creativity and provision so that the church may continue gathering and serving the community.

Saturday 20 | Refugees – Today on World Refugee Day, pray with Christians forced to flee their homes for safety. Ask God to comfort them and open new doors of opportunity and encouragement.

Sunday 21 | One With Them Sunday – Today we remember our brothers and sisters who are held captive simply because they follow Jesus. Pray that they feel God’s nearness and will remain strong in their faith.

Monday 22 | Iraq – In Iraq, choosing to follow Jesus can mean losing your job and long-term unemployment. Ask God to open doors for jobs in safe workplaces.

Tuesday 23 | Syria – Elias*, a Syrian brother, lost seven family members in last year’s church bombing in Damascus. He shares: “We ask you to pray that we can resist every enemy, seen or unseen, and every thought that keeps us from glorifying God.”

Wednesday 24 | Eritrea – Pray that the Lord will continue to build His Kingdom in Eritrea despite human efforts to thwart the Church. Pray for the Lord’s continued guidance to all who lead churches (recognized or outlawed) and that they would know how to care for those God have given them while also finding a productive way to engage authorities.

Thursday 25 | Venezuela – There is fear that the government could become much harsher, even prohibiting church gatherings. Pray with church leaders as they respond to these challenges.

Friday 26 | China – Pray for Christian students in China. Once-vibrant student fellowships on university campuses have largely disappeared, with only a few continuing in secret. Ask God to guide them.

Saturday 27 | Mozambique – Our sister Josephina is grieving the loss of her husband and four children who remain missing after extremist attacks in Mozambique. She and hundreds are displaced. Pray for comfort and restoration.

Sunday 28 | Laos – Pray for the Salt and Light Project that helps local churches work closely with our local partners to build relationships with local authorities through community initiatives, like school support.

Monday 29 | Nicaragua – Pray for emotional restoration, spiritual healing, and renewed hope for a people living under a system of increasing repression, where authorities have consolidated total control over public life, dismantling institutional checks and persecuting any form of dissent.

Tuesday 30 | Nigeria – A recent video released from extremist group ISWAP tells Nigerian Christians: “Convert or die” and that all Christians are “legitimate targets.” Pray fervently for protection.
